NASHVILLE PUBLIC LIBRARY CELEBRATES THE MAGIC OF TICHENOR

Library Invites All To Rediscover His Classic, Made New

NASHVILLE, Tenn. – Nashville Public Library (NPL) is celebrating today's would-be 102nd birthday of one of Nashville's — and the nation's — most consequential puppetry artists with free performances of his classic show, made new.

Now through February 22, the Library's Wishing Chair Productions team of performing artists will present **The Little Rabbit Who Wanted Red Wings** by Tom Tichenor, <u>a cherished American puppeteer</u> who decades ago **founded NPL's renowned puppetry program** before his career took him to Broadway — and, later, back to Nashville.

First recorded in 1978, Tichenor's adaptation introduces a lovable and wideeyed character, Little Rabbit, who learns a lesson about why you shouldn't make silly wishes.

To recreate this decades-old show as faithfully to the original as possible, Wishing Chair harvested sound from the 1978 recording, as well as a later version of the show that ran in the mid-2000s.

The reimagined show features Nashville performing artists **Pete Carden** as the spoken voice of Little Rabbit; **Evelyn O'Neal** as Mother Rabbit; **Jennifer Kleine** as Mrs. Gray Squirrel; **Ginger Sands** as Mrs. Puddleduck and **Fred LaBour** (also known as Too Slim from the GRAMMY Award-winning Western group *Riders In The Sky*), reprising his roles from the original 1978 recording as the voices of Professor Groundhog and Pinkney Green.

<u>All shows</u> are free and open to everyone in the Children's Theatre at the Main Library, 615 Church Street in downtown Nashville.

Wishing Chair Productions, supported by generous donations through the **Nashville Public Library Foundation**, creates original, world-class theater for people of all ages. These full-scale, literature-based productions are performed for free at the Main Library and at community sites across Davidson County, thanks to NPL's Puppet Truck.
